What is going on in the classroom?

It has been a very busy couple of weeks! The sixth graders have been settling into routines and hard at work!

I will be sending home a bi-weekly newsletter letting you know about what is going on in my classroom, upcoming dates to remember, and any other notes that need to be passed along.

In religion class, we are learning about the bible. We have reviewed how to find bible passages and how the bible is set up.

In math class, we are reviewing a lot of concepts that were learned last year. You should expect math homework to come home most days. Since our classes are only 45 minutes long, the assignment is usually given at

the end of the class. Anything not finished is to go home as homework. There will be a test every 10 chapters.

In science, we have been learning about the rock cycle. The rock cycle is used to explain how rocks change form. We are learning about three forms of rocks: sedimentary rocks, metamorphic rocks, and igneous rocks.

The students have had a lot of fun this week making bubble gum rocks and rocks out of sand and glue. Next week, we will be making food rocks!!
